-The Washington and Jefferson National Forests together form 1.8 million acre of land and are together one of the largest public land blocks on the east coast. This forest has over 40 different species of trees, over 200 species of

birds and over 100 species of fish and 80% of the forest is allowed for hunting. There are also over 2,000 miles worth of hiking trails, along with campgrounds (contemporary, traditional, primitive, cabins), boat/canoe launches, shooting ranges, picnicking areas, swimming and waterfalls. Rockbridge is in the Glenwood & Pedlar Ranger District section of the

Important Bird Areas – Upper Blue Ridge Mountains holds a significant amount of diverse and numerous types of birds.

Wildlife Trails: Peaks of Otter Loop- This trail is named for the three peaks at the headwaters of the Big Otter River. This trail offers beautiful views, historical sites, and large areas of neotropical breeding grounds.
